Dear Professor Bunge,

It is already some time ago that I received your book "Intuition and Science" as also "La Filosofia en el Siglo XX", which both you kindly sent me. And I want to express to you my very best thanks.

I read already a lot in your book "Intuition and Science" and I find it very interesting, especially your discussion of mathematical intuitionism. As to your criticism of Husserl, I agree with it in many respects, but nevertheless I have the impression that it might be a bit overdone. In particular, as concerns Husserl's attitude towards the foundations of mathematics, the reference to his "Philosophie der Mathematik" can hardly be taken as an argument against his phänomenologische Philosophie; for Husserl had essentially changed his philosophical views since that work of his youth. (It is known that he then did fully justice to the work of Frege.)

In your kind letter of June 30 you wrote me about the bad situation in Argentine; so I was much pleased to see that you are now living in Montevideo. I hope that you have found there satisfactory and agreeable conditions for your working and teaching.
