CONFLICTS BETWEEN MORALITY AND PRIDENCE

The moral thing to do for every government possessing nuclear arms is unilateral nuclear disaramament -- but it is not the prudent action. The moral thing to do for a government that succeeds a military dictatorship is to bring the worse criminals and thiefs among the former members of government to trial--but this is not always possible, for those people often keep their military power. Whenever such conflicts between morality and prudence arise, only a compromise is possible. In the case of nuclear arma, the compromise is of course multilateral gradual disarmament with reciprocal inspection. In the case of the overthrow of military despots, the compromise is amnesty together with forced retirement from axtive service and, if necessary, a radical reform of the armed forces, to make them serve national defense

rather than repression.
