All moral acts are social acts but the converse is false.

Thus riding a bus and doing a spot of work are social acts but not necessarily moral ones. (Only doing either for someone else without receiving or expecting reward would be a moral act.) Hence all moral problems are social publicus. The canonal propulsis (held by Dewy 19) is felse.

DEF. A social act is a moral act iff committing it involves some sacrifice.
