

CONSEQUENTALISM MANICHAEANISM

Most people see good and evil detached from one another, forming disjointed realities. & The manicheans and the Stoics elaborated on this simple idea. The more experienced we might have always known that good & evil do not just coexist in parallel but that the one can give rise to the other. Good actions can have bad consequences; e.g., if we give charity to a person capable of finding a job, we shall contribute to turning him into a parasite. And evil actions may have wholly unanticipated good consequences; e.g., World War I led to the break-up of the Austro-Hungarian empire and to the Russian Revolution.

Good can turn into evil and conversely (because of either chance or because of short-sightedness).

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
