AD SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY OF TECHNOLOGISTS WHISTLE BLOWING

Technologists are employees of private companies or government agencies. professionals As such they owe allegiance to their employers. But they are also citizens and, as such, they have the responsibility of "blowing the whistle", i.e. that are technically flawed or objecting and even going public, if they become involved in projects likely to hurt the public interest. In fact about one in ten of the engineers asked in one survey (Westin 1986) reported that, within the past two years, on moral grounds they had had to object to some work or practice of their corporation. However, only a few bring such matters to the public attention, and when they do so they can be expected to be fired; only four states in the US have passed laws protecting "whistle blowers" from reprisals.
