1. Introductions.

Verbs in the Present Simple, Possessive Adjectives. Prepositions.

2. Places. Describing a place (size and location; character; information; directions).

Personal pronouns. Order of adjectives.

3. Information and services. (Asking about times. Travel information  
Completing a form)

Present Simple. Auxiliary DO. Interrogatives. Adverbial phrases  
of time. Indefinite Pronoun: ONE.

4. Personal feelings. (Talking about likes and dislikes. Making choices: music, food, drink. Expressing feelings and opinions.)

Verb DO. Verb + Gerund. Auxiliary CAN. Present Continuous Tense.

5. Descriptions and instructions. (Asking for information. Describing a room. Asking for and giving directions. Getting and refusing permission. Following written instructions.)

Determiners: a; some; any; how much; how many. Future arrangements in the Present Continuous Tense. Adverbs.

6. Requests and complaints. (Explaining about hotel accommodation.

Requesting and offering alternatives. Writing about the past.)

Past Simple Tense (Regular and irregular verbs) Use of DID. Personal Pronouns: Subject and Object. Comparisons. Adverbs of Frequency

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7. Personal Exchanges. (Talking about the past. Discussing future plans. Describing important past events. Explaining and apologising. Talking on the telephone.)

Infinitive of Purpose. Future plans and intentions: WILL. Past Continuous Tense. Superlatives.

8. Plans and activities. (Making suggestions. Giving an interview) Present Perfect Tense.

9. Suggestions and refusals. (Written instructions. Giving advice. Refusing invitations. Thanking and congratulating.)

Present Perfect Tense with JUST/ALREADY. Must. Adverbs of time.

10. Starting a conversation. Helping a foreign visitor.

Present Perfect and Past Simple Tenses compared. Indirect Questions after KNOW. Order of adverbs. Reflexive pronouns.
